Dear Ms. Ohman:

This letter is to acknowledge your March 26, 2025, letter requesting an extension of time to submit the 2024 DSSMRs for the Carmen-Smith and Leaburg-Waltermville Projects, FERC Nos. 2242 and 2496. Your letter explains that the delay is based on recent staffing issues. As additionally clarified in your March 24, 2025, email to me, you have made progress on your reports but would benefit from more time to complete internal reviews and finalize the documents. This justification is acceptable. We have reviewed your request and determined that the delay will not negatively affect project safety. Your extension request is granted, and the new due date for 2024 DSSMRs is April 28, 2025. Please note that, contrary to your letter, this extension request was not previously granted by my March 24, 2025, email. That email only accepted your proposed process to handle future extension requests.
